Section One Motivation

The ministry of Gospel Outreach exists to resource and equip Christians to share the Gospel message to those who have not yet heard. This mission of sharing the Gospel message is at the very heart of God's plan to redeem a lost world. The well known Bible teacher Derek Prince highlights the priority of sharing the Gospel in the following quote:


"The supreme purpose of every true Christian church, the chief duty of every Christian minister, the main responsibility of every Christian layman, is to present to all who maybe reached, in the clearest and most forceful way, the basic facts of the gospel of Christ, and to urge all who hear to make the definite personal response to these facts which God requires. To this, the supreme task, every other duty and activity of the church, must be secondary and subsidiary."

Why would Derek Prince place the sharing of the Gospel so high on the priority list? When we ask groups in our seminars this question we get a range of responses. However, the common response is that people are lost without Jesus and facing eternity in hell if they die in their sin so we must share the good news that Jesus can save them! The question all Christians need to ask themselves... Do we really believe what the Bible says about the final destination of those outside of Jesus? Do we care enough to do something about it?

We must do more than just intellectually agree with what the Bible teaches. We must put what we believe into practice. To understand that there are multitudes around us who have never heard a clear Gospel message and therefore have no chance of receiving God's forgiveness must cause us to take action. The following letter written by an atheist challenges us to back up what we say with action...

"Did I firmly believe, as millions say they do, that the knowledge and practice of religion in this life influences destiny in another, religion to me would be everything. I would cast aside earthly enjoyments as dross, earthly cares as follies, and earthly thoughts and feelings as vanity. Religion would be my first waking thought and my last image before sleeping. I would labour in its cause alone. I would esteem one soul gained for heaven worth a life of suffering. Earthly consequences would never stay my hand or seal my lips. Earth, with its joys and its grief's, would occupy no moment of my thoughts. I would strive to look upon eternity alone, and on the immortal souls around me so soon to be everlastingly miserable or everlastingly happy. I would go forth into the world and preach to it in season and out of season, and my text would always be: "What shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul?"

What a challenge! What a wake up call! The great missionary C.T. Studd read the above letter and concluded that this should be how the normal Christian lives. Studd went on be a missionary in China, India and Africa where he preached the Gospel and planted churches until the day he died. What is going to be your response? I pray this manual helps to equip you for a lifelong commitment of sharing the Gospel with others.



Section Two Spreading the Gospel with Tracts

Why use Gospel tracts?

- 1. The main reason to use tracts is that God works through them to save people.
- 2. Tracts can get inside homes and stay there. You can't.
- 3. Tracts never lose their temper or become involved in arguments.
- 4. Tracts never flinch or show cowardice.
- 5. Tracts can stick to the point without compromising.
- 6. Tracts never get discouraged.
- 7. Tracts are willing to travel anywhere.
- 8. Tracts can work 24 hours per day.
- 9. Tracts are not expensive.
- 10. Tracts can be read many times over.
- 11. Tracts contain portions of Scripture, which God will use and bless (Isaiah 55:10, 11).

What can I do with Gospel tracts?

- 1. Leave in phone booths.
- 2. Put in greeting cards.
- 3. Give to attendant at fast food drive through.
- 4. Put on car windows in parking lots.
- 5. Leave on sitting areas of shopping malls.
- 6. Pass out door to door.
- 7. Stick up on bulletin boards.
- 8. Put in pockets of used clothing given away.
- 9. Display in church foyer, on tables at the exits
- 10. Pass out at parades, festivals, and special events.
- 11. Leave in city parks on benches, etc.
- 12. Leave at funeral homes.
- 13. Hand out at stadium entrances, etc.
- 14. Mail out to names in a telephone book.
- 15. Leave in Laundromats.
- 16. Give to attendants at garages, etc.
- 17. Leave in motel rooms (in the drawers, telephone book)
- 18. Leave in glove compartment of car you test drive.
- 19. Give to students at Sunday school.
- 20. Include in bills paid by mail.
- 21. Slip in pump handles at self-serve gas stations.
- 22. Hand to store employees, check-out clerks.
- 23. Leave in returned library books.
- 24. Put in magazines in waiting rooms.
- 25. Send to relatives/friends.
- 26. Put in correspondence to prisoners, etc.
- 27. Leave in bank where deposit slips are.
- 28. Leave in restrooms at restaurants, etc.
- 29. Leave with tip in restaurants.

- 30. Give to hospital and nursing home patients.
- 31. Leave on tables at flea markets.
- 32. Hand out at picnic areas, beaches.
- 33. Leave on seats on bus, cab, airplane, etc.
- 34. Leave in lockers at the gym.
- 35. Pass out on busy street corners.
- 36. Put in mouth of vending machines.
- 37. Pass out at schools after dismissal.
- 38. Leave in cafeteria at work, school.
- 39. Leave for newspaper boy, postie etc.
- 40. Put in each box or bag of merchandise sold.
- 41. Put in airport lounges, bus terminals, etc.
- 42. Send to relatives/friends.


Section Three Sharing the Gospel with 'The Test'

Why use 'The Test' tool?

- 1. The Test concept connects with people
- 2. It contains diagrams and pictures which helps understanding
- 3. It uses plain everyday language
- 4. It is a simple way of starting a conversation with someone
- 5. It is easy to learn
- 6. It is not too long
- 7. It is theologically accurate
- 8. It honours God
- 9. It can be easily taught to someone else for multiplication
- 10. It helps keep the conversation on track
- 11. It lowers the intensity for both the person sharing and the person listening as the tool is the focus
- 12. It is engaging
- 13. It gives a balanced message of law and grace
- 14. It can be practiced and used over and over again
- 15. It helps build confidence as you know what to say and where the conversation is heading
- 16. It includes a link to the Questions of Life website which answers commonly asked questions
- 17. It contains the most explosive message on earth (The Gospel)

Excuse me, can you help me with something? It only takes a few minutes, we call it the The Test.




It's a Christian test, you just have to be honest...

First question:

Do you consider yourself to be a good person?

OK, here's The Test... just be honest...




Now you may know this but we have just looked at 5 of the Ten Commandments.

Have you heard of the Ten Commandments?

Sadly, if I'm honest with you I also have to tick all the boxes, I'm no better than you.

So here's the problem...



"We have all broken God's laws", "All of us are guilty".


When we break God's laws we are saying to God that we don't respect Him and want to live for ourselves. Because of this attitude there is now a big barrier between us and God.

Turn the page.


"If this barrier remains up at death there is only one place left for you... Hell".

It is a tragic place and is what you and I deserve...

Point to the barrier and the word 'Hell' as you mention each.




Turn the page.



That's the bad news but here's the Good News...

Even though you deserve Hell God wants to forgive and save you. To do this He sent his Son Jesus Christ to the earth. Jesus lived a perfect life and then died on a cross to take the punishment we deserve on Himself, we broke the law and Jesus paid our fine. 3 days after He died He rose to life again, removed the barrier and made a bridge for us to cross over back to God.


Turn the page.



To cross the bridge you simply have to do two things.

Firstly, be willing to turn away from what you know is wrong. You won't be perfect but you need to turn away from those things that offend God.

Secondly, surrender yourself to Jesus, ask Him to forgive you and enter your life. When you do this He takes you from this side to the other side. You can't cross over yourself, only Jesus can get you across.



Last question, If you die tonight, what side would you be on?

If they answer Heaven...

Ask them graciously 'Why did you choose heaven?'
Depending on how they answer you will get an idea if they are Christians or not. Answers like 'I'm a good person, I hope to get there, God forgives everyone, I want to be there, it's a better option than hell etc' will need to be gently challenged and a further explanation of what it means to turn and surrender may be required. You may also want to share how you came to Jesus (the point of decision) to help them understand what it means. If after you explain further they admit they will are heading for hell, take them through the Hell answer (below).

If they say that they are a Christian and have already turned and surrendered you can explain the booklet to them and suggest they take it and share it with others.

If they answer Hell...

Ask them 'Does that concern you?' If they say it does concern them you can ask if they want to cross the bridge by turning and surrendering to Jesus. If they say yes you can take them through the cost section in the follow up booklet and summary questions on the following page and explain further about what it means to commit their lives to Jesus. Pray with them as you feel led.

If they say no it doesn't concern them you may want to let them know about the reality of hell and the tragedy it would be if they ended up there. If they still aren't concerned leave them with a booklet and let God convict them.

If they answer 'I don't know' or 'I'm in the middle'...

Turn back to the 'Turn and Surrender' page and go through what it means, ask them if they have done those 2 things. Make it clear that if they haven't they are on the wrong side then progress to the hell answer (see previous page).

If after clarifying with a person that they are on the wrong side it is time to ask them if they want to cross the bridge by turning and surrendering to Jesus.

If they answer NO or want time to think about it...

You may want to reason with them about the fact they have no guarantee of another day on earth and this is an opportunity for them etc. If they still decline or are obviously not ready, go through the back of the booklet with them highlighting the cost section and the prayer at the back. Let them know that the prayer is not anything special but if they are genuine God can hear them. Make sure you have your details in the back of the booklet (phone or txt mobile).

If they answer YES...

You can take them through the cost and summary questions (next page) to explain further about what it means to commit their lives to Jesus. Pray with them as you feel led.


Keys for the cost and summary questions...

The goal of the cost section in the follow up booklet and summary questions is to try and make sure the person understands what they are doing before committing themselves to Christ. We want to avoid false or shallow commitments. If a person is not willing to accept the cost of following Jesus then we need to leave them in God's hands and not try to force a 'decision'. It is better to give them the follow up booklet with your details in the back and invite them to read it and get in contact with you if they have questions etc.

If they have been through the summary questions, are willing to accept the benefits and costs of following Jesus you may want to pray the prayer in the back of the booklet with them or ask if they want to pray to Jesus.

Follow Up...

It is important after a person has committed to follow Jesus that you have a number of options for follow up. A good start is to take down their details and give them your contact details so you can get in touch again. You may invite them to meet again for a coffee and begin to personally disciple them or you could invite them to a small group. There is no one size fits all approach so be flexible. The key is to give them every opportunity to make a good start in the faith and have people in place who can commit to working with them for the long term.

Sharing the Gospel with the 'Flip Chart'

Excuse me, have you done the test yet?



It's The Test, it only takes a few minutes, it's a Christian test, you just have to be honest.

First question: Do you consider yourself to be a good person?

OK, here's the Test... just be honest...

Turn the cover page over to show the first picture



This first picture has two parts to it. The first is a picture, the second is a word.

Can you see the picture? (a face)

Can you see the word? (the word is 'liar')

The question for you is "Have you ever told a lie?"

If they answer Yes...

Say that you too have told a lie, and what does that make us? Liars. It's not very nice, but it's true.

Next picture...

Point at theif image



What do you think this picture is conveying? That's right, theft. Have you ever stolen anything (the value is irrelevant)?

If they answer Yes...

Say that you too have stolen something in your life (if you have) and what does that make us? Theives.

Turn to the next image



Last picture. You can see that this person is very angry.

Have you ever been angry and hated someone, even for a moment in time?

If they answer Yes...

...explain to them that the Bible says if we hate someone in our heart we are murderers at heart.

Ok, we have only looked at three of the Ten Commandments. The question is...


"If God judges you by the standard of the Ten Commandments when you die would you be innocent or guilty?"

You would be guilty and so would I.

So here's the problem...

Turn the page and point to the diagram on the top left of the page.

"We have all broken God's laws", "All of us are guilty"...



When we break God's laws we are saying to God that we don't respect Him...

Point to box on other side of the diagram.

...and want to live for ourselves.

Because of this attitude there is now a big barrier between us and God.

Point to the barrier.

"If this barrier remains up at death there is only one place left for you...Hell".

It is a tragic place and is what you and I deserve.

That's the bad news but here's the Good News...

Turn to the second diagram...



Even though you deserve hell God wants to forgive and save you. To do this He sent his Son Jesus Christ to the earth. Jesus lived a perfect life and then died on a cross...

Point to the cross on the diagram.

...to take the punishment we deserve on Himself, we broke God's law and Jesus paid our fine. Three days after He died He rose to life again, removed the barrier and made a bridge for us to cross over back to God.

Point to barrier and bridge on the second diagram...

...then go to the third diagram at the bottom left of the page.




To cross the bridge you simply have to do two things. Firstly, be willing to turn away from what you know is wrong. You won't be perfect but you need to turn away from those things that offend God.

Secondly, surrender yourself to Jesus, ask Him to forgive you and enter your life. When you do this He takes you from this side to the other side.



Section Four Keys to Good Communication

Pray, Pray, Pray!

It is clear from the Bible that it is only God who can convict and save a person (John 6:65). We want God to be working through us to impact the lives of others. One of the ways to make sure we are in the right place for God to use us is to make sure we are close to Him through confession of sin and consistent connection through prayer. This can never be underestimated.

Practice, Practice!

Learning any skill takes time and effort so it should be no surprise that learning to share the Gospel will require work. Unfortunately, there is no shortcut, magic pill or special prayer that will take the place of good old hard work and commitment. The more you practice the more comfortable and confident you will be when you share with someone 'live'. The better you know the presentation the more you can focus on the person you are sharing with.

Be Prepared

Before approaching someone to share the Gospel make sure you have everything you need (laminated booklet open to the right page and follow up booklet). The laminate should be clean and the follow up booklet in good condition (not bent, creased etc).

Breath and Body Odour

These are basic considerations but if they are neglected the effect is disastrous. The chance of someone staying and listening to us if we have bad breath or body odour is remote at best. By keeping some chewing gum handy and applying deodorant we can avoid these issues.

Appearance

It is important to look as 'normal' as possible. We might like wearing multi coloured flared pants with a pink shirt but if we are trying to reach businessmen with the Gospel it will cause problems. Dressing in a similar way to those you are wanting to communicate with increases the chance of them staying to listen.

Choosing the right situation to share

Not everyone is going to be suitable for a one on one encounter. A large part of making sure we have a good encounter with someone is simply to choose a good time to share with them. A good opportunity would include the following:

- The person looks like they have time on their hands
- They are not surrounded by others who could overhear the conversation
- There is room to sit next to them if they are seated
- They are not preoccupied watching children, sports etc
- There is not a lot of noise around so they can hear clearly
- There is enough space around them so they don't feel trapped

Make a good introduction

Making a good friendly introduction is possibly the most important 'skill' when looking to share the Gospel. The goal is to set the person at ease, explain what you want to do and share the Gospel with them. Here is the basic introduction we use: Excuse me, can you help me with something? It only takes a couple of minutes. We call it 'The Test', it's a Christian message so nothing weird. Here's the first question... (begin working through the presentation).

Body Language

Basic etiquette is important when sharing the Gospel. Respecting a person's space is another way of helping them feel at ease. When approaching a person it's important to give them time to see you coming by getting eye contact early and starting with a greeting from a distance. Once the initial contact is made you can position yourself closer so they can see the booklet.

Tone of voice

Our tone of voice plays an important role in making the person feel comfortable. By being gentle and relaxed we can help put them at ease. If our speech is as natural as possible we increase the chance of the person connecting with us and staying to listen.

Angle of the booklet

We must remember that the booklet is primarily for the benefit of those we are sharing the Gospel with. They must be able to see it clearly so make sure the angle is towards them.

Intensity Level

By trying to connect with a persons emotional level we will better be able to communicate to them i.e. someone who is a bit hyperactive will need us to speak a little quicker and be a bit more expressive than someone who is just chilled out and may prefer we speak a little slower and come across relaxed.

Speed of Delivery

Ideally, we want to be able to work through the Gospel message in a way that flows, without stops and starts etc. This can only happen through practice. Once a person senses that the presentation is moving along and won't take all day they will be much more relaxed and ready to listen.

Eye Contact

Eye contact is important when you first approach the person and when you say goodbye but should be kept at a minimum during the Gospel presentation. By keeping your eyes on the booklet and only making eye contact occasionally with the person you're speaking to you minimise the intensity and increase the chance of the person concentrating on the presentation and hearing the message.

Section Five Keys to Reaching Friends and Family

1/ Make a list of people in your sphere of influence who are not saved (friends, family, workmates, neighbours etc)
2/ Commit to pray for them: Ask God to soften their hearts, convict them of sin, free them from deception, humble them, enable them to believe the Gospel, bring other Christians into their lives, protect them from demonic influence, to save them etc. List some specific prayer requests here
3/ Pray and look for ways of doing them good: Acts of service, listen to them, encourage them, pray with them, be patient with them, be compassionate to them, let them see the fruits of the Spirit in your life etc. List some practical ways you can demonstrate God's love to your lost friends, family and workmates

4/ Pray and look for an opportunity to share the Gospel with them. The Bible says in Rom 10:14 "How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?" Make a list of the various opportunities you could have to share with each person on your listshare during a lunch break?, Share over coffee? Ask them to let you practice using 'The Test' on them? Etc
5/ Keep repeating steps 2,3 and 4 until God saves them or they finally reject Him at death. Make a declaration that you will not give up until everyone of the people on your list has had the opportunity to respond to the Gospel
6/ Make sure you have a good follow up and discipleship strategy in place. What resources/people do you have to help follow up and disciple a new believer? What do you need to do to get personally equipped?
7/ Train others to use this 7 step plan. Who could you teach/train to follow these steps in their own life?

Section Six Keys to Overcoming Fear

Prayer

Just as the apostles prayed to God for boldness in Acts, we too need to go to God and ask for courage and boldness. We may not experience a 'feeling' of boldness when we pray but we can know that God will help us as we step out in faith to share the Gospel. I still experience fear when I go out sharing but as soon as I begin sharing the fear seems to fade away as I rely on God's enabling and focus on someone other than myself for a change.

Training

Another key for lowering your fear levels is to get some practical training from an experienced evangeliser (someone who shares the Gospel) or a good evangelist (someone who is called to equip and train other Christians to share the Gospel). A good trainer should help you understand what to expect, how to be effective and pitfalls to avoid. They will also be able to take you with them when they go out sharing so you can see real life examples without the pressure of sharing yourself. You will realise quickly that there is nothing to be afraid of.

Practice

As part of your preparation before going out to share the Gospel you will want to practice with a Christian friend before you try to reach non-Christians. The more you practice the more comfortable and confident you will be when you share with someone 'live'. By knowing how you are going to start the conversation, what to say once you do start and how you're going to conclude the conversation you will have a much

greater chance of having a good evangelism encounter. Again, a good trainer will be able to take you step by step through a good training plan.

Partnership

By joining with others for outreach we can be encouraged and supported as well as encourage and support others. This helps us overcome our fears. If you can't find someone else to go with, Jesus said that He will never leave us or forsake us and so you can know He will be with you!

Perspective

Another key to lowering our fear levels is to get an accurate perspective. If you are living in the Western world the chances are you are not going to experience any physical threats or martyrdom for sharing your faith. The worst that may happen is you get verbally abused but if you approach a person in a friendly manner (as we train people to) you shouldn't experience much hostility. This is in sharp contrast to the context in which Jesus gave the command to preach the Gospel to His disciples. All of them with the exception of John died martyrs deaths! There are still many Christians around the world being martyred today so we in the West have no excuse. So often what we think will happen when we go out to share the Gospel never happens anyway. Let's keep reminding ourselves that the time is short and even if we face some persecution (physical or verbal) it will pale into insignificance in heaven.







Personal Disciplines and Accountability

"Means to an end, not an end in themselves."

"Discipline yourself for the purpose of godliness."

NSAB

Throughout the New Testament we are told that we can do nothing of spiritual value in our own strength.

Jesus highlights this truth in John 15:1-8 where he says in verse 5 "Yes, I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from me you can do nothing."

While it is true that we can perform all sorts of 'good' works in our own strength (including evangelism) and look very spiritual in the process, Jesus says unless we are intimately connected to him and allowing the Holy Spirit to control our lives we are unable to produce true spiritual fruit. With this truth in mind, the following disciplines are not to be an end in themselves but a means to an end - a closer, more intimate relationship with God... Father, Son and Spirit.

Bible Reading



"Man does not live on bread alone, but every word that comes from the mouth of God." ~Matthew 4:4

This is one the fundamental practices of the Christian life. If we want to know God's will for us there is no better place to start than the Rible

By reading and obeying it consistently we will become much more effective in our witness as our lives become more like Jesus Christ. The Bible has been described as spiritual food for the Christian so we must make sure we are having regular 'meals' if we want to be spiritually strong and stand up to the attacks the enemy throws at anyone who wants to share the Gospel.

Prayer



"Devote yourselves to prayer" ~ Colossians 4:2

Just like any relationship, if we stop talking to the person we love, the relationship starts to decline.

Prayer is a critical lifeline between us and God whereby He can guide, strengthen and encourage us as we seek to do His will. Without regularly spending time alone with God we run the risk of losing connection with Him and minimising our usefulness.

Nutrition

What we eat has a big effect on how we feel, our energy levels and our mood etc. A good balanced diet is essential to have a healthy body and mind which we need if we want to maintain a consistent evangelistic lifestyle.

It is recommended that we take at least 5 or more servings of fruit/vegetables daily, drink plenty of water (6-8 glasses), avoid high sugar/fat foods (sweets, cake, takeaways etc) and generally eat a healthy/balanced diet. 
Exercise



"For physical training is of some value..." ~1 Timothy 4:8

Regular exercise has proven to help prevent many of the diseases we face today. It helps strengthen the heart, increases circulation, flushes out waste, improves our immune system and generally increases our energy levels and quality of life.

If we want to be active in ministry for a long period of time exercise is a key. If you haven't exercised in a while a good brisk walk for 30min 3x a week would be a good start (you could distribute tracts in letter boxes on your way). At least 30min of activity that gets your heart pumping (jogging, weights, sports etc) 4 times a week is ideal.



Outreach



"I pray that you may be active in sharing your faith, so that you will have a full understanding of every good thing we have in Christ." ~Philemon 1:6 (NIV)

There is no better way to improve your ability to communicate the Gospel than regularly getting out with lost people and sharing it. The more we do this the better we will become at it. Sharing the Gospel is like any other skill, it takes concentrated practice if we want to get good at it.

Integrity

Apologetics and Key Scriptures

Answers to commonly asked questions

"I don't believe in God; prove to me that God exists"

Do you see that building over there (point to a building), have you ever met the builder to that building?...no. Do you agree that it was built by a builder?...yes. Do you know of any building that didn't have a builder?...no. Have you ever seen a painting that didn't have a painter?...no. As I look out on the complexity and beauty of Creation, I am compelled by common sense and logic that it was created. Building-Builder, Painting-Painter, Creation-Creator. There is no question as to whether or not God exists, as everything made has a maker. The fact of the existence of the Creator is axiomatic (self-evident). That's why the Bible says, "The fool has said in his heart 'There is no God'" (Psalm 14:1). The professing atheist denies the common sense given to him by God, and defends his belief with the thought that the "Who made God?" question can't be answered. This, he thinks gives him license to deny the existence of God.

"If God gives me some 'sign,' then I will believe."

The unsaved often want a "sign" from God. Highlight to them the signs God has already given to them...the testimony of creation, their conscience, the Bible and the fact that you (a Christian) are sharing with them at that time/place.

"Who made God?"

There is no question as to whether or not God exists. Every building has a builder. Everything made has a maker. The fact of the existence of the Creator is axiomatic (self-evident). That's why the Bible says, "The fool has said in his heart 'There is no God'" (Psalm 14:1). The professing atheist denies the common sense given to him by God, and defends his belief with the thought that the "Who made God?" question can't be answered. This, he thinks gives him license to deny the existence of God. The question of who made God can be answered by simply looking at space and asking the question, "Does space have an end?" Obviously, it doesn't. If there is a brick wall with "The End" written on it, the question arises, "What is behind the brick wall?" Strain the mind though it may, we have to believe (have the faith) that space has no beginning and no end. Exactly the same applies with God. He has no beginning and no end. He is "eternal."

"Doesn't the 'Big Bang' theory disprove Genesis?"

Try and think of any explosion that has produced order. Does a terrorist bomb create harmony? Does a car explosion result in a shining new Ferrari? Big bangs cause chaos. How could a big bang produce a rose, apple trees, fish, sunsets, the seasons, hummingbirds, polar bears - thousands of birds and animals, each with its own eyes, nose and mouth?

Here's an interesting experiment: Empty your garage of every piece of metal, wood, paint, rubber and plastic. Make sure there is nothing there. Nothing. Then wait for ten years and see if a Mercedes evolves. Try it. If it doesn't appear, leave it for 20 years. If that doesn't work, try it for 100 years. Then try leaving it for 10,000 years. Here's what will produce the necessary blind faith to make the evolutionary process believable: leave it for 250 million years.

"New scientific revelations about supernovas, black holes, quarks, and the big bang even suggest to some scientists that there is a 'grand design' in the universe." (U.S. News & World Report, March 31, 1997). A child can see that there is "grand design" in Creation.

"Seeing is believing. If I can't see it, I don't believe it exists."

We believe in many things that we can't see. Ask a skeptic if he has ever seen the wind? Has he seen history? Has he ever seen his brain? We see the effects of the wind, but the wind is invisible. We have records of history, but it is by "faith" we believe that certain historical events happened. Television waves are invisible, but an antenna and a receiver can detect their presence. The unregenerate man has a "receiver." However, the receiver (his spirit) is dead because of sin (see Ephesians 2:1). He needs to be plugged into the life of God, and then he will come alive and be aware of the invisible spiritual realm.

"There is no absolute truth. You cannot be sure of anything!"

Those who say that there are no absolutes are often very adamant about their belief. If they say that they are absolutely sure, then they are wrong because their own statement is an absolute statement. If they are not 100% sure, then there is a chance that they are wrong and they are risking their eternal salvation by trusting in a belief that could be wrong.

"When you are dead, you are dead."

What if you are wrong? What if God, Jesus, the prophets, the Jews, and Christians are right and you are wrong? If there is no afterlife, no Judgment Day, no Heaven and no Hell, then God is unjust and each of the above are guilty of being false witness. It means that Almighty God couldn't care less about the fact that a man rapes a woman, then cuts her throat and is never brought to justice. If you are right, and there is no ultimate justice, you won't even have the joy of saying, "I told you so." However, if you are wrong, you will lose your soul and end up eternally damned. You are playing Russian roulette with a fully loaded gun.

"Why is there suffering? That proves that there is no 'loving' God."

- 1. Let's face it most of the suffering around the world is caused by people. Why is there starvation and death in so many countries? It is because of selfish people who are not prepared to share their wealth with the needy. How much of your money have you given to a needy person lately? Why don't you sell what you have and give it to the poor if you are so concerned about them? We shouldn't blame God; we need to look at ourselves.
- 2. The Scriptures inform us that we live in a fallen creation. In the beginning, God created man perfect and he lived in a perfect world, without suffering. It was Heaven on earth. When sin came into the world, death and misery came with it. However, this is not the end of the story. God promises a new Heaven and a new earth. In that coming Kingdom there will be no more pain, suffering, disease or death. We are told that no eye has ever seen, nor has any ear heard, neither has any man's mind ever imagined the

wonderful things that God has in store for those who love

Him.

- 3. Draw a line. Explain that if this line represents eternity and you place a dot on the line representing a persons life it would not even register. Compared to eternity our lives are incredibly brief. However, our brief time on earth decides where we will spend eternity (with or without God). God wants all people to turn to Him while they are alive but knows that for some people the only way He can get through to them is to allow suffering to occur in their life to make them realise their need of God and repent. At times it is God's mercy that allows us to suffer if ultimately we turn to Him. CS Lewis said "God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks to us in our conscience, but shouts in our pains: It is His megaphone to rouse a deaf world."
- 4. There is a real devil and demonic forces at work in the world. They are focussed on destruction.

"I think you are intolerant to say that Jesus is the only way to God; are all the other religions wrong?"

- 1. Jesus was the One who said that He was the only way to God. For Christians to say that there are other ways to find peace with God is to bear false testimony. In one sweeping statement, He discards all other religions as a means of finding forgiveness of sins. This is in line with other Scriptures: "Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under Heaven given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12), "For there is one God and one Mediator between God and men, the Man Christ Jesus" (1 Timothy 2:5).
- 2. All religious beliefs cannot be true as they vary so much. While appearing superficially the same they are at their core fundamentally different. You simply cannot be a Hindu, Muslim, Christian and Buddhist at the same time. We believe that the Christian world view (based on the Bible) is the truth.

"Why are there so many different religions?"

It has been well said that "religion" is man's way of trying to deal with his guilt. Different religions have different ways of attempting to rid themselves of sin and its consequences. They fast, pray, deny themselves legitimate pleasures or chasten themselves, often to a point of inflicting pain. This happens because they have a conception of what they think God (or "the gods") is like. They then go about establishing their own righteousness, being "ignorant of the righteousness which is of God." The "Good News" of the Christian faith is that no one need suffer the pains of religious works. The blood of Christ can cleanse our conscience from the "dead works" of religion (Hebrews 9:14). Jesus took our punishment upon Himself, and He is the only One who can save us from sin and death. See Acts 4:12.

"Are you saying that Christians are better than non-Christians?"

The Christian is no better than the non-Christian, but he is infinitely better off. It is like two men on a plane. One is wearing a parachute and the other is not. One is not better than the other, but the man with the parachute on is certainly better off than the man who is not wearing a parachute. The difference will be seen when they jump. Jesus warned that if we "jump" into death without Him, we would perish.

Our great problem is a law that is even harsher than the law of gravity. It is the Law of an infinitely holy and just Creator. The Scriptures warn us, "It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the Living God." They tell us that we are His enemies. The truth is that of all the different opinions out there, they cannot all be right. (There has to be something that is true and Jesus said He was the Way, the Truth and the Life and that no-one comes to the Father except through Him.)

"Religion has caused more wars than anything else in history."

It is true that man has used religion for political gain. Hitler had "God with us" engraved on the belts of Nazi soldiers. America said, "Praise the Lord and pass the ammunition." The law may even allow you to start the Christian Nazi Party, if you so desire. You can become a "reverend" for a few dollars through the tabloid classifieds and then further your political agenda with the world's blessing, no matter how much it smears the name of Christ.

If Jesus told His followers to love their enemies, and someone puts a knife into someone's back in the name of Christianity, it doesn't take a rocket scientist to figure out that something isn't quite right. If we human beings can detect it, how much more will God? He will deal with it on Judgment Day.

"What about all those people who have never heard the Gospel? Will they all go to Hell because they haven't heard about Jesus Christ?"

- 1. God wants people to be saved far more than anyone else (including the person asking you the question). He has numerous ways of reaching out to people who have yet to hear the Gospel (missionaries, dreams/visions etc) so there will be no-one on judgement day with an excuse. As for you, have you committed to Jesus?
- 2. No one will go to Hell because they haven't heard of Jesus Christ. People will go to Hell for murder, rape, adultery, lust, theft, lying, etc. Sin is not failing to hear the Gospel, "sin is transgression of the Law" (1 John 3:4). If we really care about them, we will become missionaries and take the good news of God's forgiveness in Christ to them.

Arguments against the theory of evolution...

- 1. Something cannot come out of nothing. The most common evolutionary theory for the origin of the universe is the Big Bang theory. The logical fallacy behind this is that it means that in the beginning there was nothing and then nothing exploded. Where did the cosmic dust / energy which exploded in the Big Bang come from? Nothing cannot explode.
- 2. Order does not come out of chaos. Our universe is not random and chaotic. Our earth is perfectly balanced in its position in the Solar System to support life. Explosions create chaos and disorder. The implication of the Big Bang theory is that the universe is proceeding from disorder to order. The opposite is true. The Second Law of Thermodynamics says that the universe is becoming more random and disorganised, not more organised.

- 3. Life does not come out of non-life. The study of genetics is showing that even the most simple organisms have incredibly complex DNA. There is no possibility that life with the ability to reproduce itself could come out of an explosion or chemical reaction. Evolutionary scientists are coming up with more and more bizarre ideas for the origin of life, like the idea now being promoted on the BBC that simple life forms originated in distant parts of the universe, survived crossing the universe on the back of comets which then crashed into the earth and produced the life of this planet.
- 4. Complex life forms cannot have evolved. Evolutionary scientists, including Darwin himself, recognise that organs like the human eye are unbelievably complex. Darwin actually said that there is no possibility that the eye could have evolved. Richard Dawkins contradicts Darwin saying that it could have evolved over thousands of generations. But this raises a logical fallacy. While the eye was evolving the creature was blind. Blind humans cannot survive without the help of the sighted. So what happened for millions of years while the eye evolved? This argument applies to all evolutionary leaps. Without wings the average bird is not going to survive very long in the presence of the average cat. How did birds survive for millions of years while they evolved their wings? Until they had two perfectly functioning wings, the evolving wings would actually have been a hindrance not a help. Even more crucial is the reproductive system of different creatures. Think about the incredibly complex and diverse reproductive systems of birds, bees, butterflies to say nothing of humans. Every part of the system, both male and female, has to be functioning perfectly. If not, how many generations does the species have? One. It does not have millions of years to evolve the reproductive system. Either it works and the creature can reproduce itself for millions of generations. Or it does not work and the creature dies out after the first generation.

5. The missing fossil record: Despite the evidence being pathetic, even if you claim the title of World's Biggest Optimist, evolutionists still tell the story that once upon a time humans evolved from ape-like creatures.

Many years ago this argument seemed credible to a lot of people because there was so little hominid fossil evidence that it was easy to imagine evolutionary links everywhere.

But things have changed. Thousands of fossils and fossil fragments of apes and humans have now been found — and they don't show a steady progression from apes to humans at all. Fossils have been found in the wrong timeframes, put into the wrong categories before all the evidence was in, and what was once thought to be the ape-human family *tree* now actually has no trunk — just unconnected branches.

Because evolutionists can't change their theory, they are stuck with the evidence looking more confusing for them with each new hominid/homin/hominine fossil discovery. Instead of *clarifying* the alleged link between apes and humans, new fossil discoveries are making it *harder* to show which type of ape or ape-like creature evolved into a human.

Alternative view

We believe that the evidence is stronger for those who believe the Bible's account of Creation — that in the beginning God created the world and all the major types of creatures to reproduce "after their kind".



My past is redeemed, my present makes sense, my future is secure. I'm finished and done with low living, sight walking, smooth knees, colorless dreams, tamed vision, worldly talking, cheap giving & dwarfed goals.

My face is set, my gait is fast, my goal is heaven, my road is narrow, my way is rough, my companions are few, my guide is reliable, my mission is clear. I won't give up, shut up, let up until I have stayed up, stored up, prayed up for the cause of Jesus Christ.

I must go till He comes, give till I drop, preach till everyone knows, work till He stops me & when He comes for His own, He will have no trouble recognizing me because my banner will have been clear."



St Francis of Assisi Controversy

Have you ever had someone look down on you for trying to communicate the Gospel using words? No doubt someone has 'quoted' "Preach the Gospel at all times. Where necessary, use words." This they say was spoken by St Francis of Assisi. The following article by Ray Comfort raises serious doubts about the authenticity of the heretical quote...

One hundred and fifty thousand children had been on the brink of starving to death, but thanks to the kind gift of a very generous billionaire, every child now had enough food to keep him alive. That gift had arrived in the form of one big check. The horror was now over. It was finished. It was just a matter of distributing the food using the few relief workers we had. Without them to get the food to the children, there would have been many more deaths.

Some days later, a frantic worker burst into the camp and cried, "Some of the relief workers have stopped distributing food. Masses of children are dying!"

Why would the workers stop when there was plenty of food? It didn't make sense. The distraught man said, "It's because one of them held up a sign that said, 'Feed the starving children. Where necessary, use food.' That has caused some of the workers to simply befriend the starving children without giving them food. It's insane!"

The first time I ever heard of Saint Francis of Assisi was back in 1965. It was during the surf movie "The Endless Summer." Four surfers who were chasing the sun discovered the perfect wave, at a place in South Africa called "Cape Saint Francis." The sight of the perfect wave excited me beyond words.

The Unspeakable Gift

The next time I heard of him was when I heard that he said "Preach the Gospel at all times. Where necessary, use words." That statement upset me beyond words, because it was a philosophy that I knew sounded deeply spiritual . . . to those who were spiritually shallow. It made as much sense as "Feed starving children. Where necessary, use food."

On 16 July 1228 Francis of Assisi was pronounced a saint by Pope Gregory IX. That's a long time ago, so it's a little late for questions, but if I could I would like to find out why anyone would say such a strange thing? Was it because he was fearful to use actual words to preach the truth of the Gospel? Or was it because he thought that people would see that he had good works and hear the message of salvation without a preacher, something contrary to Scripture's "How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher?" (Romans 10:14).

Whatever the case, 800 years since Francis we have many who profess faith in Jesus, and are no doubt using this popular philosophy to justify being speechless. To them salvation truly is an "unspeakable" gift.

Recently someone told me about a conference where 100,000 Christians gathered to worship God. When I asked if they were exhorted to go out and preach the Gospel to every creature, it was no surprise to me that they weren't. Instead, they were exhorted to live a life of worship. Again, that sounds spiritual, but you can't worship God without obedience to His Word, and His Word commands us to preach the Gospel to every creature.

I regularly meet those who think they can obey the Great Commission without using words. When they hear the Gospel preached that are usually offended and say things like, "I appreciate what you are saying, but I don't like the way you are saying it." With a little probing, they are the relationship folks, who think preaching the Gospel means building relationships with the lost, and never mentioning words like "sin," "Hell," and "Judgment Day." They think that real love is to withhold the Bread of life from those that are starving to death. Remember that Jesus said, "Whosoever therefore shall be ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and

sinful generation; of him also shall the Son of man be ashamed, when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels" (Mark 8:38, italics added).

According to the dictionary, a "sissy" is "a timid or cowardly person." From what I understand of Saint Francis, he was no sissy. He was a loving man who was not afraid to use words when he preached. He wasn't frightened to preach repentance to a sinful world. However, there have been times when I could have been called that name. I have felt the grip of fear and have wanted to drop words such as sin, Hell, repentance and Judgment Day when I have preached to sinners. I don't want to come across as being unloving or judgmental, but I fear God more than I fear man. So when God's Word tells me to use words, I use words, despite the consequences.

Listen to the Apostle Paul's sobering warning to his hearers: "Wherefore I take you to record this day, that I am pure from the blood of all men. For I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God" (Acts 20: 26-27). Perhaps he spoke about being free from their blood because he was familiar with God Himself warning Ezekiel of his responsibility to warn his generation: "When I say to the wicked, 'You shall surely die,' and you give him no warning, nor speak to warn the wicked from his wicked way, to save his life, that same wicked man shall die in his iniquity; but his blood I will require at your hand." (Ezekiel 3:18, italics added).

When someone thinks that they can feed starving children and not use food, that's their business. But when their philosophy spreads throughout the camp, it becomes an unspeakable tragedy. If we become passive about the Great Commission because we are more concerned about ourselves than the eternal well-being of others, we may be able to hide our motives from man, but not from God. He warns, "Deliver those who are drawn toward death, and hold back those stumbling to the slaughter. If you say, 'Surely we did not know this,' does not He who weighs the hearts consider it? He who keeps your soul, does He not know it? And will He not render to each man according to his deeds?" (Proverbs 24:11-12).

There's an interesting irony to this story. After a little research I came across a quote about the famous saying. It is from someone who had been a Franciscan monk for 28 years—and had earned an M.A. in Franciscan studies. He co ntacted some of the most eminent Franciscan scholars in the world to try and verify the saying. He said, "It is clearly not in any of Francis' writings. After a couple weeks of searching, no scholar could find this quote in a story written within 200 years of Francis' death." (1.)

So if it wasn't Saint Francis who said not to use words, who was it? Who is it that would like to see the truth of the Gospel hindered from being preached to every creature? That doesn't need to be answered.

The time is short. The laborers are few. Please, cast off your fears and equip yourself to preach the Gospel with words. They are necessary.


Letter from an Atheist

As a young man CT Studd was thinking about the direction of his Christian life when he came across the following tract written by an atheist. God used this tract to challenge and stir CT Studd. It went like this...

"Did I firmly believe, as millions say they do, that the knowledge and practice of religion in this life influences destiny in another. religion to me would be everything. I would cast aside earthly enjoyments as dross, earthly cares as follies, and earthly thoughts and feelings as vanity. Religion would be my first waking thought and my last image before sleeping. I would labour in its cause alone. I would esteem one soul gained for heaven worth a life of suffering. Earthly consequences would never stay my hand or seal my lips. Earth, with its joys and its grief's, would occupy no moment of my thoughts. I would strive to look upon eternity alone, and on the immortal souls around me so soon to be everlastingly miserable or everlastingly happy. I would go forth into the world and preach to it in season and out of season, and my text would always be: "What shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul?"

In response to this CT Studd states "I at once saw that this was truly the consistent Christian life. When I looked back upon my own life I saw how inconsistent it had been. I therefore determined that from that time forth my life should be consistent, and I set myself to know what was God's will for me."

It wasn't long after this that God led CT Studd to leave his cricket career and head off to China as a missionary. He spent the rest of his life as a missionary serving in China, India and Africa where he died.



"Is This Your Life"

by General William Booth (1829 - 1912) Founder of the Salvation Army

Editor's Note:

General Booth considered the following account to be a vision. If nothing else, it is definitely an illustrative story with biblical meaning that Christians of all generations can apply in their own lives - though any "implied teaching" in the story must only be received in light of Scriptural truth.

William Booth's Vision

In my vision I thought that so far as the world was concerned, Agur's prayer [from Proverbs] was answered in regard to me, for I had neither poverty nor riches. All my wants were supplied. I had leisure, and friends, and home, and all that was necessary to make me happy.

Then also, I thought that I was a Christian. Most of my close friends professed to be the same. We visited together at each other's homes, joined in amusements, business, politics and many other things. In short, we bought and sold, and married, and acted as though the world we were in were going to last forever.

In this vision I was one who was active in religious activities. In fact, I considered myself to be quite a shining light. I always attended church on Sunday and I taught in the Sunday school. Now and then, though not very often, I visited the sick. And in addition to these good deeds I gave a little money to support Christian work.

In all this I was quite sincere. I had no idea of playing the hypocrite. It's

true that I didn't stop to consider what Christianity really was, although I talked freely enough about it at times, and pitied people who didn't profess to be Christians.

I seldom, if ever, considered what Jesus Christ required. Nor was I very concerned about the lost, although I heard these matters occasionally discussed in my presence. I had gotten into a definite rut in thought and action and profession. And I went on from day to day, hoping that everything would turn out all right in the end.

But in my vision I thought that without any apparent warning a dangerous fever seized me. I became terribly sick all of a sudden. In fact, in just a few hours I was brought to the very brink of death. This was serious business, indeed. Everyone about me was in great confusion. And those who loved me were paralyzed with fear.

Some took action. The proper medicines were administered. There were consultations among several physicians. And the members of my family hurried to my side from far and near. Friends and acquaintances came.

I was given the best medical care possible - but all proved in vain.

I could feel that the medicines weren't helping. And yet I didn't feel anything very much. I don't know whether this was because of the suddenness of the sickness or the deadening character of the narcotics which the physicians gave me. But strangely enough I seemed to be the least disturbed person in the place.

I felt as though I were in a dream. I knew I was ill - dangerously ill - because a relative had insisted on my being informed of my real condition. And yet I was not disturbed about the fact. I thought I would recover.

Most people do, I suppose, until the hand of death is actually upon them.

And if I did not recover, I had no reason to be terribly concerned, because, wasn't I a Christian? Hadn't I been converted? Didn't I believe the Bible? Why should I fear?

And wasn't I continually hearing hymns being sung and prayers offered that I might be restored to health, and if not, that I might pass away without suffering, and have a good time of it in heaven?

But even so, disquieting thoughts did cross my mind - because I couldn't keep out questions that kept arising as to whether I had truly followed Jesus Christ and had done my duty to a perishing world with my time and influence, and money and family. And questions would come and go that were very difficult indeed to answer. Yet it was all in a dreamy way. How could it be otherwise, with the burning fever lapping up the vital current, and my brain all benumbed, and my energies laid prostrate.

So when I complained that I didn't have much joy or assurance, I quite naturally agreed readily to the suggestion that my condition prevented this. And I felt, moreover, that if I were not "ready" I had neither the time nor energy to begin so serious a business over again as the salvation of my soul. Besides, how could I confess that I had been mistaken all these years, and that my life had been a failure? No! It was too late, and I was too ill for any such confession.

One thing I could do, and that I did. I cast myself, with what force of soul I had left, on the mercy of my Savior. And again and again I repeated a verse which had always been a favourite of mine:

"I am a poor sinner, just nothing at all, But Jesus Christ is my all in all."

It was with this sentence on my lips - a sentence taken up and reproduced at my funeral service - that a cold numbness seemed to come creeping over me, and a great difficulty of breathing seized me. My friends were alarmed. I read it in their faces. Some prayed, while others wept. And my dear ones moistened my lips and kissed my brow.

Meanwhile a strange faintness seized me. I lost consciousness.

Entrance Into Heaven

My next sensation was altogether beyond description. It was the thrill of a new and celestial existence. I was in heaven.

After the first feeling of surprise had somewhat subsided, I looked around me, and took in the situation. It was way beyond anything of earth - positively delightful. And yet some of the more beautiful scenes and sounds and feelings of the world I had just left appeared to be repeated in my new experience in enchanting fashion. Still no human eyes ever beheld such perfection, such beauty. No earthly ear ever heard such music. No human heart ever experienced such ecstasy, as it was my privilege to see, hear, and feel in the celestial country.

Above me was the loveliest of blue skies. Around me was an atmosphere so balmy that it made my whole physical frame vibrate with pleasure. Flowing by the bank of roses on which I found myself reclining was the clearest and purest water of a river that seemed to dance with delight to its own murmurings. The trees that grew upon the banks were covered with the greenest foliage, and laden with most delicious fruit - sweet beyond all earthly sweetness. And by lifting up my hand I could pluck and taste.

In every direction above and around me the whole air seemed not only to be laden with the sweetest perfumes coming from the fairest flowers, but filled with the fairest forms. For, floating around me were beautiful beings whom I felt by instinct were angels and archangels, seraph and seraphim, cherub and cherubim, together with the perfect blood-washed saints who had come from our own world. They were sometimes far, and again coming nearer.

The whole sky at times seemed to be full of white-winged, happy, worshiping, joyous beings. And the whole country, apparently of limitless extent, was filled with a blissful ecstasy that could only be known by being experienced.

You may perhaps imagine my sensation. At first I was swallowed up with a sort of ecstatic intoxication, which feeling was immediately enhanced by the consciousness that I was safe, saved, to suffer and sin no more.

And then suddenly, a new set of feelings began to creep over me. Strange as it may seem, I felt somewhat lonely and a little sad, even in the midst of this infinite state of bliss. Because up to this moment I was alone. Not one of the bright beings who were soaring and singing in the bright ether above me, nor the ones who were hastening hither and thither, as though bent upon some high mission, had spoken to me or approached me.

I was alone in heaven! Then, in a still stranger and mysterious way, I appeared to feel in myself a sort of unfitness for the society of those pure beings who were sailing around me in indescribable loveliness. How could it be? Had I come there by mistake? Was I not counted worthy of this glorious inheritance? It was indeed a mystery.

An Evaluation Of My Life

My thoughts went back to earth. And all before me, as though unfolded by an angel's hand, the record of my past life was unrolled before my eyes. What a record it was! I glanced over it. And in a glance I seemed to master its entire contents - so rapidly, indeed, that I became conscious of a marvellous quickening of my intellectual powers. I realized that I could take in and understand in a moment what would have required a day with my poor, darkened faculties on earth.

With my quickened mind, I saw, to my delight, at that very first glance, that this register of my earthly existence - the Divine biography of my life - contained no record of any misdeeds before my conversion. And then came another thought, more wild than any that had gone before it. (You must remember that it is a vision I am relating.) It was this: Would it be possible for me to obtain permission to go back to the world, to that very part of it from which I had come, clothed in some human form, and live my earthly life over again - live it in a manner worthy of my profession, worthy of my Christ and my opportunity? Could this be?

If at that moment an answer in the affirmative had been brought to me, I would have gladly given up my heavenly blessedness. I would have gladly undergone ages of hardship, ignominy, poverty and pain. I would have given up a million dollars in money. Yes, I would have gladly given a world, if it had been mine to give! But I could see no hope for a second probation. What

was to be done?

Three Visitors

I had not been musing in this way for many seconds, for thoughts appeared to flow with remarkable rapidity, when, quick as a lightning flash, one of those bright inhabitants which I had watched floating far off in the clouds of glory, descended and stood before my astonished gaze.

I can never forget the awe-struck feelings with which I beheld this heavenly being. Describe the shape and features and bearing of this noble form I cannot, and will not attempt it. He was at the same time angelic and human, earthly and yet celestial. I discerned therefore at a glance that he was one of the "blood-washed multitude" who had

"come out of the great tribulations of earth." I not only judged from a certain majestic appearance which he bore, but from instinct I felt that the being before me was a man, a redeemed and glorified man.

My mind was running in this direction when I think my visitor must have discovered something of what I was thinking, and felt pity for me. Seeing my consternation, he spoke again.

"Where you find yourself is not actually heaven," he said, "but only its forecourt, a sort of outer circle. Presently, the Lord Himself, with a great procession of His chosen ones will come to take you into the Celestial City itself. There is where your residence will be if He deems

you worthy; that is, if your conduct on the battlefield below has pleased Him.

The paragraph above is not intended to imply that a person can earn their way into heaven. At the end, it will make sense why this was said in the context of the story.

"Meanwhile, I have obtained permission to come and speak to you concerning a soul who is very dear to me. I understand he lives in the neighbourhood where you recently lived, and from which have just come. Our knowledge of the affairs of earth is, for our own sakes, limited, but now and then we are permitted to get a glimpse.

And now the bright spirit turned those eyes on me that, beaming with love and concern, were more beautiful than ever. She said again: "My

"A Vision Of The Lost"

by General William Booth (1829 - 1912) Founder of the Salvation Army

On one of my recent journeys, as I gazed from the coach window, I was led into a train of thought concerning the condition of the multitudes around me. They were living carelessly in the most open and shameless rebellion against God, without a thought for their eternal welfare. As I looked out of the window, I seemed to see them all... millions of people all around me given up to their drink and their pleasure, their dancing and their music, their business and their anxieties, their politics and their troubles. Ignorant - willfully ignorant in many cases - and in other instances knowing all about the truth and not caring at all. But all of them, the whole mass of them, sweeping on and up in their blasphemies and devilries to the Throne of God. While my mind was thus engaged, I had a vision.

I saw a dark and stormy ocean. Over it the black clouds hung heavily; through them every now and then vivid lightening flashed and loud thunder rolled, while the winds moaned, and the waves rose and foamed, towered and broke, only to rise and foam, tower and break again.

In that ocean I thought I saw myriads of poor human beings plunging and floating, shouting and shrieking, cursing and struggling and drowning; and as they cursed and screamed they rose and shrieked again, and then some sank to rise no more.

And I saw out of this dark angry ocean, a mighty rock that rose up with it's summit towering high above the black clouds that overhung the stormy sea. And all around the base of this great rock I saw a vast

platform. Onto this platform, I saw with delight a number of the poor struggling, drowning wretches continually climbing out of the angry ocean. And I saw that a few of those who were already safe on the platform were helping the poor creatures still in the angry waters to reach the place of safety.

On looking more closely I found a number of those who had been rescued, industriously working and scheming by ladders, ropes, boats and other means more effective, to deliver the poor strugglers out of the sea. Here and there were some who actually jumped into the water, regardless of the consequences in their passion to "rescue the perishing." And I hardly know which gladdened me the most - the sight of the poor drowning people climbing onto the rocks reaching a place of safety, or the devotion and self-sacrifice of those whose whole being was wrapped up in the effort for their deliverance.

As I looked on, I saw that the occupants of that platform were quite a mixed company. That is, they were divided into different "sets" or classes, and they occupied themselves with different pleasures and employments. But only a very few of them seemed to make it their business to get the people out of the sea.

But what puzzled me most was the fact that though all of them had been rescued at one time or another from the ocean, nearly everyone seemed to have forgotten all about it. Anyway, it seemed the memory of its darkness and danger no longer troubled them at all. And what seemed equally strange and perplexing to me was that these people did not even seem to have any care - that is any agonizing care - about the poor perishing ones who were struggling and drowning right before their very eyes . . . many of whom were their own husbands and wives, brothers and sisters and even their own children.

Now this astonishing unconcern could not have been the result of ignorance or lack of knowledge, because they lived right there in full sight of it all and even talked about it sometimes. Many even went regularly to hear lectures and sermons in which the awful state of these poor drowning creatures was described.

I have always said that the occupants of this platform were engaged in different pursuits and pastimes. Some of them were absorbed day and night in trading and business in order to make gain, storing up their savings in boxes, safes and the like.

Many spent their time in amusing themselves with growing flowers on the side of the rock, others in painting pieces of cloth or in playing music, or in dressing themselves up in different styles and walking about to be admired. Some occupied themselves chiefly in eating and drinking, others were taken up with arguing about the poor drowning creatures that had already been rescued.

But the thing to me that seemed the most amazing was that those on the platform to whom He called, who heard His voice and felt that they ought to obey it - at least they said they did - those who confessed to love Him much were in full sympathy with Him in the task He had undertaken - who worshipped Him or who professed to do so - were so taken up with their trades and professions, their money saving and pleasures, their families and circles, their religions and arguments about it, and their preparation for going to the mainland, that they did not listen to the cry that came to them from this Wonderful Being who had Himself gone down into the sea. Anyway, if they heard it they did not heed it. They did not care. And so the multitude went on right before them struggling and shrieking and drowning in the darkness.

And then I saw something that seemed to me even more strange than

anything that had gone on before in this strange vision. I saw that some of these people on the platform whom this Wonderful Being had called to, wanting them to come and help Him in His difficult task of saving these perishing creatures, were always praying and crying out to Him to come to them!

Some wanted Him to come and stay with them, and spend His time and strength in making them happier. Others wanted Him to come and take away various doubts and misgivings they had concerning the truth of some letters He had written them. Some wanted Him to come and make them feel more secure on the rock - so secure that they would be quite sure that they should never slip off again into the ocean. Numbers of others wanted Him to make them feel quite certain that they would really get off the rock and onto the mainland someday: because as a matter of fact, it was well known that some had walked so carelessly as to loose their footing, and had fallen back again into the stormy waters.

So these people used to meet and get up as high on the rock as they could, and looking towards the mainland (where they thought the Great Being was) they would cry out, "Come to us! Come and help us!" And all the while He was down (by His Spirit) among the poor struggling, drowning creatures in the angry deep, with His arms around them trying to drag them out, and looking up - oh! so longingly but all in vain - to those on the rock, crying to them with His voice all hoarse from calling, "Come to Me! Come, and help Me!"

And then I understood it all. It was plain enough. The sea was the ocean of life - the sea of real, actual human existence. That lightening was the gleaming of piercing truth coming from Jehovah's Throne. That thunder was the distant echoing of the wrath of God. Those multitudes of people shrieking, struggling and agonizing in the stormy sea, was

the thousands and thousands of poor harlots and harlot-makers, of drunkards and drunkard makers, of thieves, liars, blasphemers and ungodly people of every kindred, tongue and nation.

Oh what a black sea it was! And oh, what multitudes of rich and poor, ignorant and educated were there. They were all so unalike in their outward circumstances and conditions, yet all alike in one thing - all sinners before God - all held by, and holding onto, some iniquity, fascinated by some idol, the slaves of some devilish lust, and ruled by the foul fiend from the bottomless pit!

"All alike in one thing?" No, all alike in two things - not only the same in their wickedness but, unless rescued, the same in their sinking, sinking... down, down, down... to the same terrible doom. That great sheltering rock represented Calvary, the place where Jesus had died for them. And the people on it were those who had been rescued. The way they used their energies, gifts and time represented the occupations and amusements of those who professed to be saved from sin and hell - followers of the Lord lesus Christ. The handful of fierce, determined ones, who were risking their own lives in saving the perishing were true soldiers of the cross of Jesus. That Mighty Being who was calling to them from the midst of the angry waters was the Son of God, "the same yesterday, today and forever" who is still struggling and interceding to save the dying multitudes about us from this terrible doom of damnation, and whose voice can be heard above the music, machinery, and noise of life, calling on the rescued to come and help Him save the world.

My friends in Christ, you are rescued from the waters, you are on the rock, He is in the dark sea calling on you to come to Him and help Him. Will you go? Look for yourselves. The surging sea of life, crowded with perishing multitudes rolls up to the very spot on which you stand.

Leaving the vision, I now come to speak of the fact - a fact that is as real as the Bible, as real as the Christ who hung upon the cross, as real as the judgment day will be, and as real as the heaven and hell that will follow it.

Look! Don't be deceived by appearances - men and things are not what they seem. All who are not on the rock are in the sea! Look at them from the standpoint of the great White Throne, and what a sight you have! Jesus Christ, the Son of God is, through His Spirit, in the midst of this dying multitude, struggling to save them. And He is calling on you to jump into the sea - to go right away to His side and help Him in the holy strife. Will you jump? That is, will you go to His feet and place yourself absolutely at His disposal?

A young Christian once came to me, and told me that for some time she had been giving the Lord her profession and prayers and money, but now she wanted to give Him her life. She wanted to go right into the fight. In other words, she wanted to go to His assistance in the sea. As when a man from the shore, seeing another struggling in the water, takes off those outer garments that would hinder his efforts and leaps to the rescue, so will you who still linger on the bank, thinking and singing and praying about the poor perishing souls, lay aside your shame, your pride, your cares about other people's opinions, your love of ease and all the selfish loves that have kept you back for so long, and rush to the rescue of this multitude of dying men and women.

Does the surging sea look dark and dangerous? Unquestionably it is so. There is no doubt that the leap for you, as for everyone who takes it, means difficulty and scorn and suffering. For you it may mean more than this. It may mean death. He who beckons you from the sea however, knows what it will mean - and knowing, He still calls to you and bids to you to come.

You must do it! You cannot hold back. You have enjoyed yourself in Christianity long enough. You have had pleasant feelings, pleasant songs, pleasant meetings, pleasant prospects. There has been much of human happiness, much clapping of hands and shouting of praises very much of heaven on earth.

Now then, go to God and tell Him you are prepared as much as necessary to turn your back upon it all, and that you are willing to spend the rest of your days struggling in the midst of these perishing multitudes, whatever it may cost you.

You must do it. With the light that is now broken in upon your mind and the call that is now sounding in your ears, and the beckoning hands that are now before your eyes, you have no alternative. To go down among the perishing crowds is your duty. Your happiness from now on will consist in sharing their misery, your ease in sharing their pain, your crown in helping them to bear their cross, and your heaven in going into the very jaws of hell to rescue them.
